Why are there sometimes multiple asol1.fits files for my observation? How do I treat these in my analysis?

An aspect solution (asol) file is created for each stable aspect interval. There are many reasons why an interval could be broken, e.g. a gap could be created by a small section of bad engineering data. When a tool requires the aspect solution, *all* the files must be input, either as a list or as a stack (see <u>ahelp stack</u> for more information).

For instance, when running <u>asphist</u>, the aspect solution file is input to the <u>infile</u> parameter. As mentioned, this may be done as a <u>stack</u>:

```
unix% pset asphist infile="@pcad_asol1.lis" unix% more pcad_asol1.lis pcadf063874624N002_asol1.fits pcadf063875522N002_asol1.fits pcadf063902942N002_asol1.fits
```

or a list:

```
unix% pset asphist \ infile="pcadf063874624N002_asol1.fits,pcadf063875522N002_asol1.fits,pcadf063902942N002_asol
```

The filenames are specific to your dataset; these are from ObsID 459.
